- ASF focuses its activities primarely on Russian Federation where it has expensive network of partnering institutions and NGOs, including
- Memorial
- Civil Assistance
- Common Action
- Soldiers' Mothers

ASF AND CENTRAL ASIA

 ASF cooperated with Kyrgyzstan since 1992 when nation just gained independence.

Reasons for cooperation:

- Political and economic reforms in the Kyrgyz Republic during 1990s, which distinguished that nation from neighbors.
- As a result, ASF sponsored the first visit of Kyrgyzstan's President Askar Akaev to the United States,

ASF AND KYRGYZSTAN

- Assistance in Promotion of Democratic Reforms in 2000s before Tulip revolution;
- Sponsorship of the Second Sakharov Congress in Kyrgyzstan which was cancelled due to protests from opposition;
- Assistance in reforms in IT area and dealing with Y2K in 1999;
- Assistance in solving critical economic infrastructure problems (e.g., national rail road re-organization)

SMD INVOLVEMENT

- ASF supported the first International Women of the Mountains Conference in Orem, UT in 2007.
- Elena Bonner served as the Honorary Chairperson.
- ASF sponsored all other WOMC as well as initiatives to advocate SMD as tool to get closer North American and Central Asian mountain communities.

ASF AND SMD INVOLVEMENT

- ASF supported international conference "Mountains and Conflict," organized by UVU jointly with Osh Technological University in Kyrgyzstan in 2012.
 - Conference studied lessons of the Osh conflict in 2010 through the angle of the tensions between poor mountain communities and rich ones living in valleys.
 - Event was part of the International Mountain Day celebration in December 11, 2012.

Future Opportunities

- There is a great potential for cooperation between two regions in the areas of IT and good governance:
- Utah is among top three in the United States on good governance potential in Rocky Mountains region in IT and modern technologies.
- This is now an important priority for Kyrgyzstan in strengthening of Parliamentary model of governance.
- Current elections in Kyrgyzstan an example of successful use of IT for democratic advancement
