- Now they are benefiting from women-centered microfinance (HELP Int'I, FINCA, Mentores Empresariales)
- Pro-women NGOs launched from Utah change agents

SUSTAIN HAITI ESTABLISHED

- Up in the mountains of Haiti, we have been laboring since the 2010 devastating earthquake for the past 5 years
- Sustain Haiti was formed by my BYU students in response to the quake that killed 300,000
- We've carried out various women's support strategies:
- Rebuilt houses & orphanages
- Carried out various microlending communal banks
- Held annual business plan competitions & funded start-ups

SUSTAIN HAITI 2010-15



MORE SUSTAIN HAITI WOMEN'S PROGRAMS

- Training women to counter domestic abuse
- Establishing clean water systems for families
- * Teaching women's health & hygiene
- Launched dozens of ESL courses for thousands of young women to get jobs
- Reforestation projects were recognized by the Clinton Global Initiative (CGI) 2013

MALI

- Since 1985 we have established various women-owned livelihood projects
- cooperatives where resources are pooled & jobs are created with profits shared equally
- Women in the mountains of Mali also now enjoy membership in thousands of new Self-Help Groups (SHGs) where village women pool their financial resources to give larger amounts to budding female microentrepreneurs
- Women health providers in each village
- 26 schools built for kids
- Over 34 village wells & women's gardens established
- Major players from Utah: Ouelessebougou Alliance, Mali Rising, Empower Mali Foundation





Ouelessebougou - Utah Alliance

The alliance works cooperatively with villagers in Ouelessebougou and surrounding regions of Mali

Founded in 1985 by a group of business & community leaders concerned about the devastating drought in North Africa during the 1980s, the Alliance was structured to give Utahns the opportunity to serve a specific African community, knowing that their assistance was going directly to those in need

25 years = 25 villages




PERU

- Pro-poor microcredit among women high in the villages & shanty towns of the Andes
- For some 22 years, we have facilitated economic development among impoverished women using traditional microcredit loans for female microentrepreneurs through our organizations there
- Andean Children's Fund, Chasqui Humanitarian, Eagle Condor, HELP International, & Crecer (Mentors International)

EAGLE CONDOR WOMEN'S SERVICES PROVIDED

- Holistic program for clients:
 - + Health exam
 - + Psychological testing
 - + Ongoing health care
 - + Village construction of schools
 - + Continual business training
 - + One-on-one business consulting
 - Monthly clinics— meet & share ideas with other entrepreneurial clients

RWANDA

- Next up, I'm launching a microfinance NGO for Rwanda widows high in African rainforest
- × 1994's mass killings of a million Tutsi people
- × 76,000 female survivors suffer from long-term effects of the genocide
- A women's association was formed to address social problems of 2 decades
- Now a new microfinance strategy will be rolled out to empower these women so they can have income sources as they move into old age in the coming years



Many are trained to assist the poorest of the poor in their quest toward a higher quality of life.


CONSIDER BEING A POSITIVE DEVIANT

GROWTH OF VOLUNTEERISM TODAY


- * \$300 billion from Americans donated to charity
- × 20.4 percent of U.S. volunteered in 1989
- × 26.8 percent more recently (63 million people)
- Utah ranked #1 in U.S. rate: 43.5 percent More than 837,000 Utah volunteers serve approximately 144 million total hrs. annually
- Annual survey of 75 mid-sized cities, Provo led the nation with a 62.9 percent volunteer rate
- Utah is becoming a social incubator

FUTURE ACTION RESEARCH NEEDED ON SCALING UP EFFORTS FOR EMPOWERING MOUNTAIN WOMEN

- × Questions:
- How to do even better by doing more?
- How to build & research the next stage?
- Can business models serve such a purpose?
- Can we design an acceleration strategy to dramatically expand NGO resources in aiding female have-nots?
- × Needs:
 - Reduce gap between existing capital & demands of the poor
 - Build an expansive acceleration strategy for reaching hundreds of millions of impoverished families (Think big!)
 - Create workable models
 - Design better implementation methods
 - Achieve replicability across nations
 - Ensure longterm sustainability

What? Increase speed of change


How? Reduce bureaucracy; improve decision making; create a sense of urgency

5 R'S OF SCALING-UP

- * Readiness for innovation to spread
- Receptivity by the target community
- * Resources required to scale-up
- * Risks that it will not turn out well
- Returns expected quality & quantity
